

Collection HS-1: UCSB Undergraduate Human Subjects Survey

(Responses from the 2019 UCSB undergraduate student survey)

A collection of survey responses from 124 UCSB undergraduates. The respondents answered 79 questions – with answers in multiple formats (including multiple choice and text-based responses). The 124 respondents represent those who completed at least the first question.

Post-Secondary Area(s) of Study

Disciplines correspond to those set by UCSB. WE1S totals include second major for double majors (weighted equally), and minors (weighted at 0.5 of a major). UCSB totals include both majors but exclude minors.
