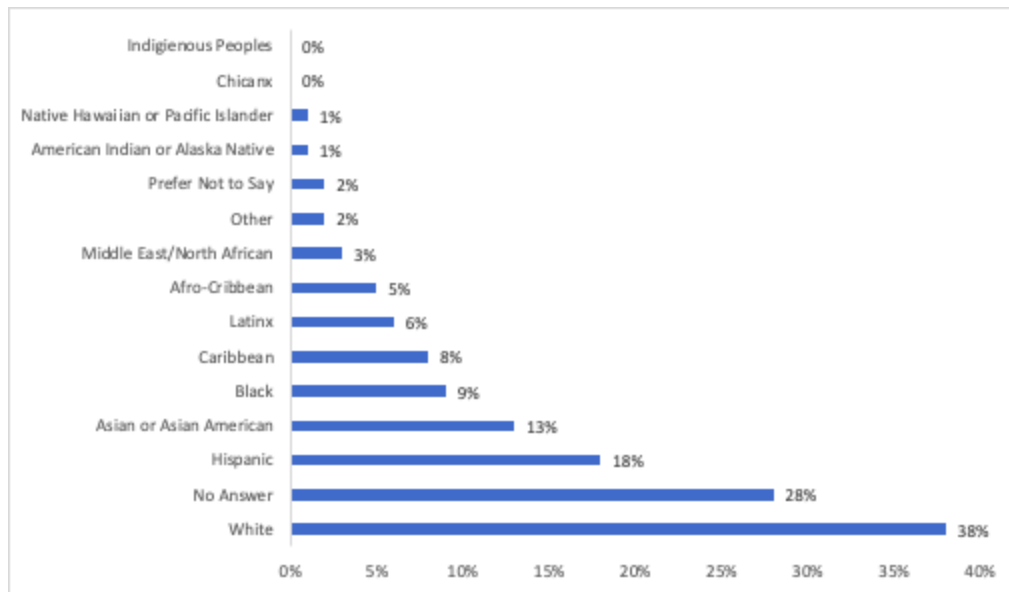


Fig. 1: Q8 results

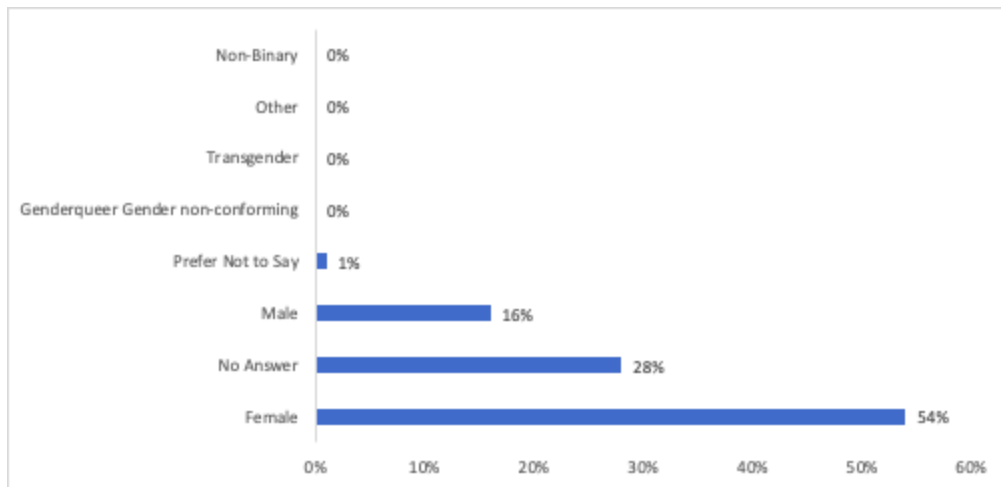


Fig. 2: QU9 results

- No answer: 29%

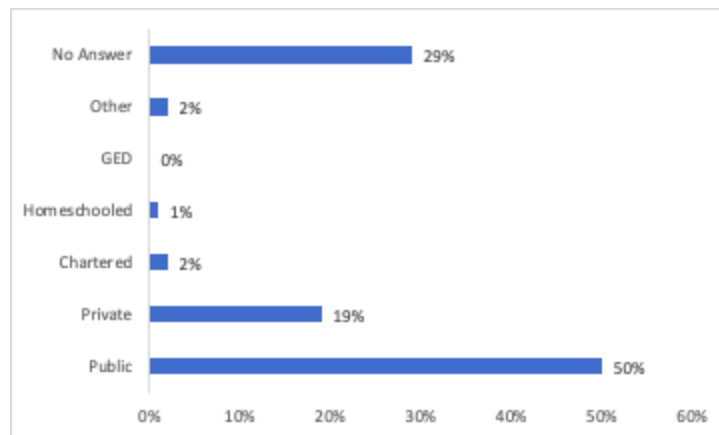


Fig. 3: QU15 results
